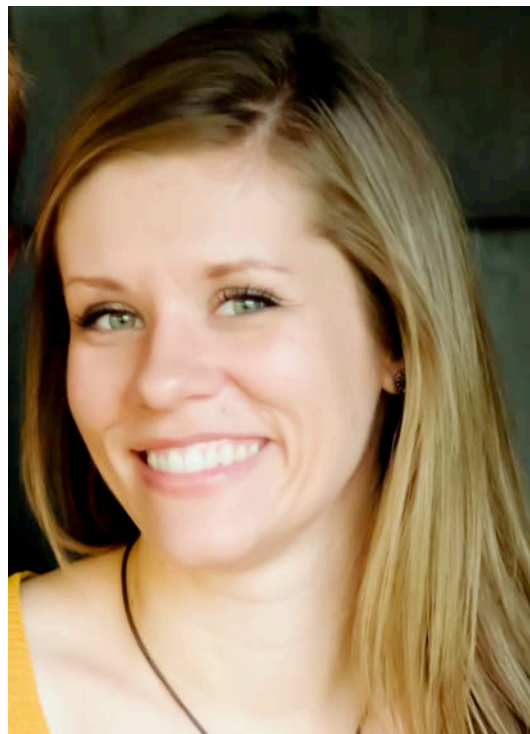

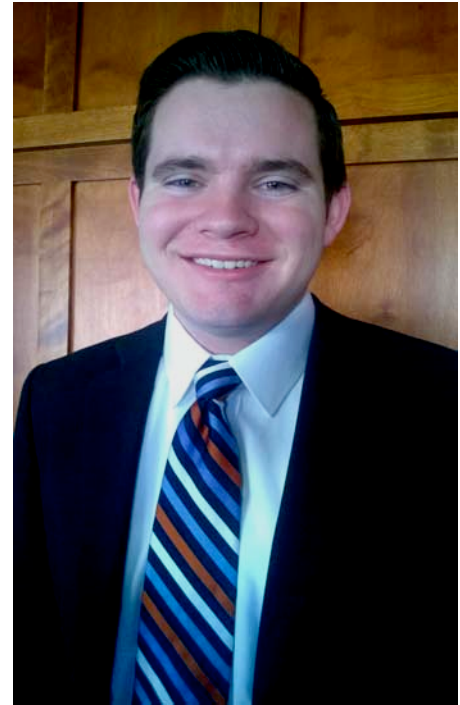
Matthew Brown
